The Museum



Addis Abeba Museum

was the former residence of Ras Birru, an honored Colonal-General, minister of war at Menelik II court. It was built around 1880 and is located on the road to Bole international Airport, just behind the Ethiopian Trade Union Building, overlooking Mesqel Square. It was established in 1986 on the occasion of the centennial anniversary of the foundation of the city. The museum is dedicated to aid people understand and appreciate the history of the city and the ongoing development. It collects and exhibits heritages of aesthetic and historical importance and illustrates the political, cultural and architectural background of Addis Ababa since 1886. Located in a charming garden, it commands one of the best views in the city across Mesqel square to the Entoto hills.

Since 2017, the Addis Abeba Museum displays works of living artists. Artists like Tamerat Siltan, Hailu Kifle, Birtukan Dejene, Girma Bulti, to name just a few, have shown their works in this historic place. In June-July 2021 there was held the first international symposium of contemporary art in Ethiopia with artists from Ukraine, Egypt, Nepal, Namibia, Turkey, Canada, Russia, Cyprus, Eritrea, Nigeria, Sudan, Serbia, and of course Ethiopia.

Addis Ababa

is the capital and largest city of Ethiopia and as a chartered city, Addis Ababa has the status of both a city and a state. It is where the African Union is based and it also hosts the headquarters of the United Nations Economic Commission for Africa (ECA) and numerous other continental and international organizations.

The city's former name Finfine (sparkling water) was changed by Empress Taitu in Addis Ababa (new flower) when she founded Addis Ababa in the year 1886.

Artist's Statement

Art is like all mysteries, a place of conversation.

On the contrary of what a number of artists of the past century have affirmed, painting is not dead. My work as a visual artist is to bring out the painting of the future. I want to explore and highlight the torments not of the real established, but of the real to build.

Biography

HuGo MoToR is born on December 2, 1956, in a small town in German-speaking Switzerland. He studies music and contributes to the creation of some albums. He writes texts in Swiss German which will be published, but will mark his departure from his native Switzerland.

He travels across Europe with his drums and ends up in Paris for 36 years. His search for new variants of sounds, colors, shapes, food for thought, leads him to create a silent opera of 1024 characters, who accompany him, from near or far still today in his art. He is interested in the concretes in which he lives. He works in search of new mineral binders and invents concrete-paint and olfactory memory concrete. He settles in the northern suburbs of Paris where he discovers the cohabitation of violence

and human tenderness. He invented himself as an artist at the service of society by bringing together young people from cities at war with each other around a giant mural project at the station they frequent and which is the terrain of their clashes.

HuGo MoToR is also a fervent watercolorist among the 232'000 more people each day, not to make a concept, nor to reproduce their present, but to dialogue with them in its search for a bright future.

In 2016 he creates a parenthesis to his German-speaking Switzerland roots to find his past and speak his mother tongue again. He settled in a place breathing the history of the beginnings of the industrialization of Swiss peasant territories, in the canton of Zurich, at Stehli-Seiden-Areal in Obfelden, where he set up his workshop. He creates a flying office with 12 painted panels and installs them in Zurich to ask passersby what racism is. But he does not hold up. His thirst for learning and forge ahead pushes him into new adventures.

He spent six months in Peru where he discovered the immense stone work of the Incas and their predecessors. His Peruvian paintings are exhibited at the Academy of Fine Arts in Cusco. After Peru HuGo MoToR leaves for 6 months in Ethiopia, cradle of humanity. But 6 months will not be enough. He gets married and begins the creation of an art center that aims to help the young people of southern Ethiopia in distress to forget their dream of dangerous fleeing to the rich countries of Europe or America in helping, through multiple artistic activities, to discover their true talents to integrate a life committed in their own country.

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Awash Wine Ethiopia

Wine making has been a part of Ethiopian culture for more than a millennium, dating back to the Axumite era. Grapes and wine were already well known in Ethiopia around the first century A.D. when they were first imported through the Red Sea Port of Adulis. Afterwards, Ethiopians started brewing traditional fermented beverages from locally available raw materials to welcome their guests. Ethiopians have been making a local wine called *tedj*, or Ethiopian mead, a honey wine flavored with an indigenous herb that remains the most popular alcoholic beverage in Ethiopia. This ancient winemaking tradition now coexists with a modern form of winemaking. Ethiopia produces a range of value and premium wines, made from locally grown grapes.

In 1936 a Greek family started the first winery in Ethiopia in Addis Ababa at Lideta, followed by an Italian family who established their winery at Mekanisa. The two ventures were nationalized in 1974 and regrouped as one entity that was named Awash Wine. Since then, Awash Wine has grown to be a household name and one of Ethiopia's most loved brands – a market leader that is interwoven with the cultural fabric of the society.

In September 2013, 8 Miles LLP, a private equity fund, became the new majority owner of Awash Wine Share Company. Since then, significant investments have been made to upgrade facilities, further improve product quality and diversify its portfolio of products. Today, Awash Wine leads the Ethiopian wine market, constantly growing and with a vision for further expansion.

Currently Awash Wine has four sites – two wineries and a Distribution Centre in Addis Ababa and a 517 ha farm with a 225 ha vineyard located in the Oromia region, Arsi Zone, Merti Wereda.

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Louvre Hotel And Tour Operator Addis Ababa Ethiopia

In 1835, in Paris, under the reign of the last king of France Louis-Philippe, facing the Louvre Museum, at No. 6 Coq Heron street, currently named Marengo Street, began operating the first "Café du Louvre."

Lineal descendant of *Aveyron's families and businesses who settled in the city and are behind most Cafes Restaurants & Hotels (CHR) of Paris, EXXM Development Group opened a hotel and restaurant, decorated with great deal of character in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.

*(Aveyron is a région of south of France)

Located in the Yeka district, near Embassies, the hotel offer 20 comfortable apartments, a French restaurant and Parisian bar style of the early twentieth century.

Large restaurant's frescoes represent Moulin Rouge dancing by Toulouse-Lautrec and Luncheon of the Boater by Auguste Renoir.

The bar and the back bar are authentic furniture from old Parisian Cafe-bar in the years of the first half of the twentieth century.

The menu holders are coming from the Ritz Hotel in Paris Place Vendome.

The photographs on the walls of the rooms are from the Crillon Hotel, on the Place of « la Concorde » in Paris. The hotel is owned by the Saudi royal family and was the favorite place of Michael Jackson.

The gym with frescoes of sportsmen, is available for all guest in the hotel and restaurant.

The cellar is located on the rift of a 15 meters long rock. It contain the finest wines available.

In line with the major economic players radiating around the Louvre, the entrance hall and the entire interior of the building is equipped with authentic furniture and decorations dating from the French and Ethiopian's nineteen century.

A Kitchen with modern equipment on a space of 90M2, is employing 20 people.

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Suisse Embassy In Addis Ababa Ethiopia

Switzerland and Ethiopia signed a friendship and trade agreement in 1933. The two countries strengthened relations following the Italian-Ethiopian War and World War II. Switzerland opened a diplomatic mission in Addis Ababa in 1955 which was transformed into an embassy in 1962.

Ethiopia is an important trading partner of Switzerland in East Africa. In 2020, trade volume between Switzerland and Ethiopia amounted to CHF 219 million. Swiss exports to Ethiopia amounted to CHF 60 million. They consist mainly of pharmaceuticals and machinery. Switzerland imported CHF 159 million, mainly gold and coffee. About thirty Swiss companies are present in Ethiopia.

The relations between Ethiopia and Switzerland are excellent. They are reinforced by different bilateral agreements and regular political consultations. Ethiopia remains a priority country in Switzerland's regional strategy for international cooperation for the Horn of Africa 2018-2021.

Each year the Swiss Confederation awards Government Excellence Scholarships to promote international exchange and research cooperation between Switzerland and over 180 other countries. Recipients are selected by the awarding body, the Federal Commission for Scholarships for Foreign Students (FCS). The Swiss Government Excellence Scholarships are aimed at young researchers from abroad who have completed a master's degree or PhD and at foreign artists holding a bachelor's degree.

The Swiss embassy in Addis Ababa regularly supports the activities of Swiss artists in Ethiopia and promotes cultural exchanges between the two countries.

Alfred Ilg, an engineer from Thurgau in Switzerland, was an advisor to the Ethiopian emperor, Menelik II from 1878 to 1907. Ilg had considerable influence on the country's foreign policy. He was the driving force behind the construction of the railway between Addis Ababa and Djibouti, thus promoting the development of the Ethiopian capital.

The 2018-2021 Strategy for the Horn of Africa also includes measures to promote peace and human security.
